**Y7 Selective High School placements in 2014:** Paper-based applications are due this Friday, 16<sup>th</sup> November for any Year 5 student wishing to be considered for placement in Year 7 at a selective high school in 2014. If you are applying online, you have until the 19<sup>th</sup> November, 2012 to submit an application.

**Reports:** Teachers are finalising Semester Two reports for their students. Completed reports will be sent home on Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> December. Parents/Carers are reminded that an appointment can be made at any time to discuss your child's progress with the classroom teacher or learning support teachers.

#### **Student Attendance:**

Improving attendance is a high priority for our school and this term we continue to want your child at school every day, unless they are sick or there are special circumstances that require them to be absent. Did you know that if your child misses as few as eight days in a school term, by the end of primary school they will have missed a whole year of education? By law, you are required to send your child to school every day. If your child has to be away from school for any reason, please either tell your child's teacher or send a signed note explaining the reason for the absence, as soon as possible and within one week of the absence. If you're having problems getting your child to attend school regularly and on time, please talk to your child's teacher or principal.

Please let us know - student absences from school: Please inform the school if you intend on taking your child out of school for a period of time, such as an extended family holiday or need to visit family interstate/overseas. It is important that such leave is discussed in order for the school to put the necessary procedures in place to support such leave occurring.

## **PBIS Focus**









This week (Week 6), our PBIS focus is, "Hands, feet and objects to ourselves"

The rule is; Being Safe.

Students are participating in explicit lessons focused on modelling the behaviour which 'safe learners' exhibit.

Some of the key points include:

- We should not hit, kick, tackle, pinch or push
- We should act sensibly and responsibly
- Do not retaliate. (Tell the teacher)
- We should not touch other people's belongings
- Be aware of people's personal space
- If someone hurts you, say, "Stop" and go directly to the teacher and report the incident
- Be safe

### Using positive language.
